WHY BLACK WALNUT TREES ARE HARMFUL:

Black Walnut trees have been found to produce a chemical called Juglans nigra which is toxic to some other plants. The chemical is present in its roots, bark, and leaves. The Juglans nigra is present in the soil and may remain there after the tree is destroyed. Adding the leaves to a compost pile is not advised. The following plants are known to tolerate the living conditions under or around black Walnut trees with success. Note that other factors may be significant variables in the success of the plants; moisture, soil texture, pH, and the amount of light received must also be taken into consideration.
