The first line of defense in stopping the deer from making your landscape lunch should be picking low browse plants. Please keep in mind that they will eat pretty much anything if they are hungry enough! There are some alternative choices to help keep the deer from munching on your landscape. Putting up a burlap shield, wrapping the entire plant in burlap, putting up deer fencing are some options. Using a repellent regularly to train the deer from coming into areas that they are not welcome, will also help keep your plants from becoming a buffet.
